

Keynote: How does OpenEd fit into DigitalEd? + Panel Discussion

Dr Catherine Cronin, Strategic Education Developer at Ireland's National Forum for the

Enhancement of Teaching & Learning in Higher Education where her work focuses on critical approaches to digital and open education, spanning practice and policy.



Individually and collectively, we have travelled far in the past 14 months. As students, staff and institutional communities, we have learned new ways to teach, learn, communicate, collaborate, offer support, provide feedback and solve complex problems – all during a time of enormous stress. Understandably, much of the focus over the past year has been about online teaching and learning, online assessment and online community-building. Thankfully, we have a wealth of expertise, research and resources in digital education on which to draw. So where does open education fit into digital and higher education post-COVID; why does openness matter? One year ago, UNESCO called on the global community to support the use of open educational resources for "sharing learning and knowledge openly worldwide with a view to building more inclusive, sustainable and resilient Knowledge Societies". This session will draw on work by higher education practitioners and researchers –within Ireland and globally– to explore how the critical use of open educational resources (OER) and open educational practices (OEP) can enhance teaching, learning and assessment for all.

In 2020, GMIT launched the new Online Careers Module and, to date, 300+ students have enrolled on the level 7, 5-credit module. This module aims to develop the student professionally and personally and equip them with the skills and knowledge to enable them to plan for and achieve their career goals. It is an excellent substitute to placement as students are brought through a 3-stage developmental programme which incorporates Self-Awareness, The Employability Toolkit and their First 100 Days in the Workplace. This presentation will look at IT Sligo's approach to developing a culture of academic integrity, the use of Epigeum's academic integrity courses (for staff and students) as a cornerstone of this development and review the integrity of online and e-assessment, including online proctoring, through the lens of the current pandemic. We will highlight alternative and authentic assessment practices that remove the need for terminal exams.





Throughout the presentation we will reference recent national developments and publications concerning academic integrity, such as the establishment of a National Academic Integrity Network (NAIN) in November 2019 by the Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI). A stated purpose of NAIN is to advise HEIs on good practice with regard to fostering an institutional culture of academic integrity. The presentation will also detail IT Sligo's five-strand approach.
