

#### Keynote - How brave can we be? Re-imagining assessment and feedback in higher education

Naomi Winstone, Professor of Educational Psychology Director of the Surrey Institute of Education at the University of Surrey, UK | Honorary Associate Professor in the Centre for Research in Assessment and Digital Learning (CRADLE) at Deakin University, Australia



Dominant approaches to assessment and feedback in higher education have shown little variability over the past few decades. Yet change is both desirable and achievable, as evidenced by the rapid developments made in response to the Covid-19 pandemic. In this talk, I will explore the potential future landscape of assessment and feedback in higher education, discussing the barriers and enablers to the development of practice. In particular, I will explore the drivers of risk aversion and argue for the importance of environments that support, rather than discourage, innovation and experimentation in assessment practice.

The BA in Law with Criminal Justice was the focus for the CUA Re-imagining Assessment Project in Donegal ATU where it was anticipated that participation would provide an opportunity for review and potential redesign of existing assessment practices in a context where experiential learning was the dominant pedagogic approach. This presentation will begin by setting out the pre-existing context and assessment practices of the programme. The focus will then move to the ABC Learning Design Framework introduced to the project team and programme team through participation in this project, culminating in its application initially at a modular, and then a programmatic level. The experience was then evaluated by participating academic staff (following the approach adopted by DCU, an early adopter of this methodology in Ireland). The presentation will conclude with a review and reflection on the experience, the evaluation and the implications for future assessment practices in this programme.

This short presentation tells the story of the re-imagining of an assignment that is linked to a practical session on handwashing methods. This practical is undertaken by first year Medical Science Students, in ATU, Galway city, as part of their Year 1 Microbiology module. Historically the students wrote an individual report on this practical, however a few years ago this was re-imagined. In groups the students now have to create an educational video for the GMITMicrobiology YouTube channel. They must detail how to carry out handwashing methods and explain the importance of them. This presentation will highlight the value of re-imagining assessment for students.
