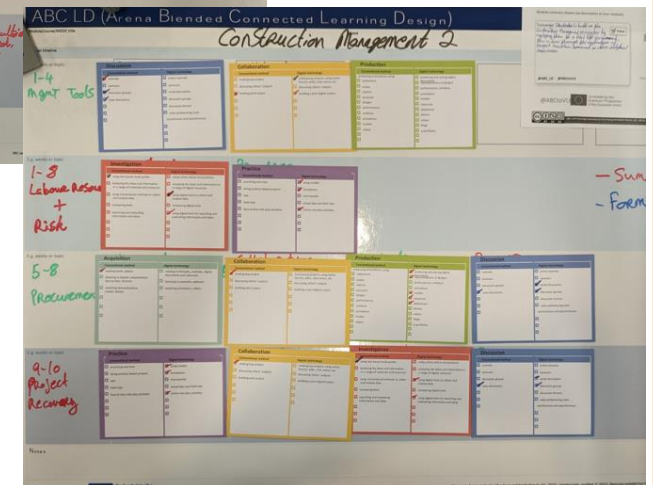
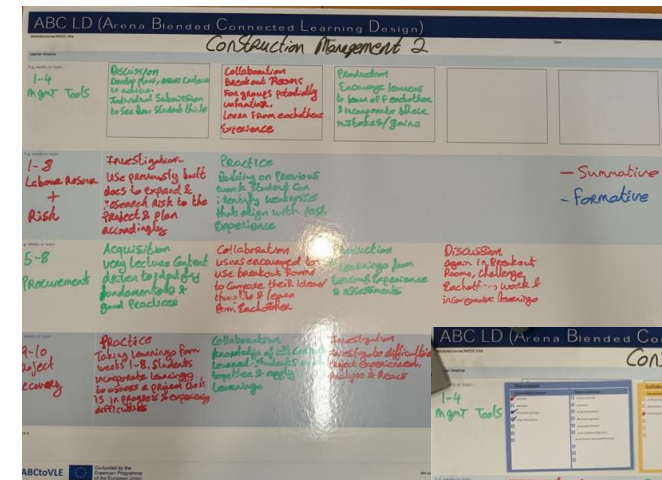
- ✓ Programme team lecturers to make at least one small change to their current practice and employ new assessment methods and TEL tools

ABC Learning workshop:

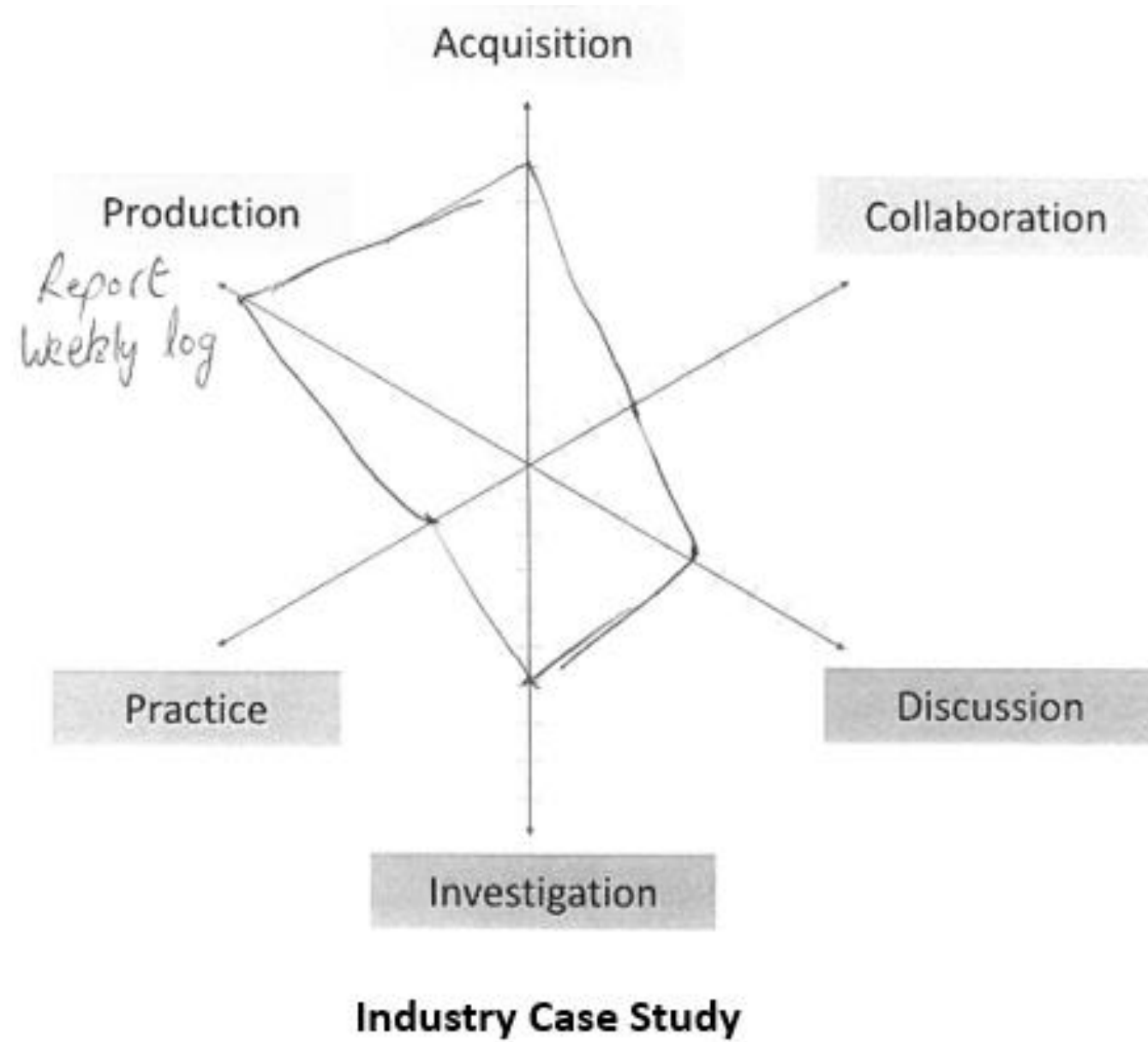
On 30 November 2022, the programme team undertook an ABC Learning Design workshop with Dr Deirdre McClay to evaluate the types of assessment methods employed across all 9 modules on the programme.

This encouraged the programme team to reflect on their own module assessment methods and consider these in the context of assessment methods adopted on other modules.

Feedback from Programme Team (June 2023):

Focus very much on practical and team working. Further focus on group sessions, determine a key list of recordings tailored for struggling attenders to promote submissions

Breaking the class into groups improved engagement from students, so I might look to enhance that.

I will try to increase the variety of assessment methods.

Feedback from Programme Team:

*“My module was essentially complete when we did the workshop, so it did not influence my assessment strategy. **I did find the reflective process within the ABC framework useful – I was able to consider my assessments through different lenses. I think the diversity of my assessment pieces covered a good breadth of the ABC types, but I feel some could be strengthened a bit, and I will consider that for the next deployment of the module.**”*

- **Have you made any changes to assessment and/or feedback practices?** *This is my first time presenting this module online so I have not implemented changes yet. However, what I have prepared is a method of further extending the theme of collaboration for next years session by changing the group sets on a number of occasions.*
- **Any future plans for changes to assessment and/or feedback?** *All assignments are individual, however, developed in group environments. Next year I may introduce the requirement of a team member environment and delegate certain portions of the assignments to individuals and mark as a group assignment.*
- **The attached “audit” compiles the information from the ABC workshop on each module (completed by Eleanor with her photographs). Did you learn anything/take anything away from this process?** *Yes the assignment of the ABC type did increase my confidence of the delivery of the module as all types were captured.*

Feedback from Programme Team:

“The ABC workshop gave me an opportunity to develop a bespoke assessment strategy for Alternative to Work Placement which now includes an aspect of students peer reviewing each others work. This module is yet to be completed but considering the variety of assessment methods has provided me with the confidence to diversify the assessment approach which I hope can encourage ongoing engagement from students on an online environment.”

“I felt that the ABC Learning Design workshop was beneficial as a programme team, this can be built upon in upcoming programme team meetings for professional re-accreditation. Encouraging shared practice can be difficult, however recording our current assessment methods provides a benchmark from which progress in the next academic year can be measured. We can track the assessment strategy changes and assess their impact.”
