*Impact can be described as any effect (short-term or long-term, positive, or negative) of an intervention. It can be direct or indirect. It can be intended: a predicted effect decided at the onset of an intervention, and it can also be unintended: an unexpected effect. Impact is related to ongoing change, but it is not 'time-bound': impact can happen during, immediately after, and a long time after an intervention has completed. Impact needs to be evaluated, observed, developed, improved and encouraged to bring about more positive outcomes for teaching and learning experience in higher education (NStEP 2021; National Forum 2019)*
